If you attend summer quarter please note that there is a delay in disbursing your funds. We cannot pay tuition, or disburse a refund to your account until after the start of the fiscal year, which is July 1. Because of this, you will not receive funds for your books, supplies, or other expenses until July 2 or later.
