To view your SAR, log in to fafsa.gov with your FSA ID by selecting "Log In" and proceeding to the student role. Once on the "My FAFSA" page, scroll down to select "View SAR."
- Submit additional financial aid applications/documentation to your school(s). Some states and schools require supplemental financial aid applications if you'd like to be considered for state and/or school financial aid programs. Visit the financial aid section of your school's website to determine if there is additional documentation you must provide to apply for these programs. Be sure to submit any required documentation by the stated deadline.
- Apply for as many scholarships as you can. This will help you limit the amount of money you may need to borrow to pay for school. Learn how to find and apply for scholarships.
- Wait for financial aid offers. You will receive a financial aid offer from each school you listed on your FAFSA form once you are accepted for admission at that school. Review your financial aid offer to determine <u>which financial\_aid\_you'd like to accept</u>. If you've applied to several schools, be sure to <u>compare aid offers</u> to see which school will be the most affordable. Each school has its own schedule for sending out financial aid offers. Contact your school's financial aid office to find out when you will receive your financial aid offer.

Note: If you need to change the information you provided on the FAFSA form, log in to your FAFSA form and select "Make Corrections."
