If your request is received within 10 days of the date of this notice, your benefits may continue at the current level while waiting for the fair hearing. In addition, you may request a prehearing conference to discuss your fair hearing request. This pre-hearing shall in no way delay or replace the fair hearing process. For LIEAP, you must request an appeal in writing within 30 days of the date of this notice. For any program, if you request to continue receiving benefits at the current level while awaiting the fair hearing, you may have to pay back any benefits you receive if the fair hearing decision is not in your favor.
