

He was educated in the Bartow County School System and graduated with the Cass High School Class of 1969. Homer proudly served four years in the United States Air Force. He was further educated at Coosa Valley Technical College and Rainbow Bible College. Homer was employed at Chemical Products Corp for 30 years. He was an electrician by trade; however, he also worked as an appliance repairman. Homer's ultimate and most rewarding job was as a repairman of human souls, as he dedicated much of his life to preaching and teaching the gospel and leading others to Christ. He wholeheartedly believed and was often heard quoting, "He that hath an ear, let him hear." Homer was very passionate about the souls and the salvation of others. For years, he taught Sunday School, ministered, and ultimately pastored at Queens Chapel Independent Methodist Church.
















His Journey's Just Begun
