Elementary School Meals cost \$1.90 for lunch and \$1.35 for breakfast. Middle/High School Meals cost \$2.75 for lunch and \$1.75 for breakfast. If your household income goes down or your household size goes up, you may apply again. If you were previously denied benefits because no one in the household received FL SNAP, FL TANF or FDPIR benefits, you may reapply based on income eligibility. If you did not provide proof of current eligibility, you will be asked to do so if you reapply.

If you request a hearing within 10 calendar days after your application was processed, your child will continue to receive meals at no charge or reduced price meals until the official decision is made.
